GRC was founded in July 2000 by Saudi businessman, Dr. Abdulaziz Sager. Dr. Sager's vision was to fill an important void and to conduct scholarly, high-quality research on all aspects of the wider strategic Gulf region including the GCC countries as well as Iran, Iraq, and Yemen. GRC operates on an independent, non-profit basis.

The GRC's belief is that everyone has the right to access knowledge. As a result, it has made all its research available to the general public through publications, workshops, seminars, and conferences. As a non-profit organization, GRC injects all income back into new programs and activities.

Chairman's Message



At a time when the Gulf region continues to gain in strategic relevance and importance, it is more urgent than ever to expand knowledge about this critical part of the world and to become more familiar with the issues that are defining its overall development. In order to do so, it is essential to promote scholarly and balanced research about the six member states of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), their neighbors that constitute the wider Gulf region, and their relations with one another as well as with the international community of nations. **The Gulf Research Center** (GRC) was created to foster greater understanding of the GCC countries and the challenges the Gulf region faces, as well as to strengthen links between Gulf scholars from different regions.

The driving force behind GRC is the achievement of excellence in three core areas of activity: research and analysis, consultancy and education. The Gulf Research Center offers 'knowledge for all' relating to the Gulf region by providing a comprehensive, independent and credible platform for advanced research and analysis focusing on Gulf foreign relations, economics and energy, politics and society, as well as labour markets and migration. In each of these areas, it is the objective of GRC and its extensive community of researchers and contributors to shed light on unexplored issues, produce relevant policy input, and generate creative solutions to many of the region's pressing challenges.

With offices in Jeddah and Riyadh, Saudi Arabia as well as Dubai, United Arab Emirates (**GRC**), Geneva, Switzerland (**GRC Foundation**), and Cambridge, UK (**GRC Cambridge**), the Gulf Research Center is well-positioned to interact directly not only with the Gulf region but also with Europe and the rest of the world, thus bringing together researchers interested in the Gulf region.

On January 28, 2021, the 2020 Global Go-to Think Tank Index Report listed the Gulf Research Center, for the 12th year in a row, as one of the leading think tanks in the Middle East and worldwide. In particular, the GRC was singled out as one of the 150 leading think tanks worldwide as well as one of the top think tanks specializing in foreign policy and international affairs. In both categories, the GRC represents the top-ranked think tank from the Gulf region and is one of the top three in the Middle East.

The annual Global Go-to-Think Tank Index Report, prepared by the Think Tanks and Civil Societies Program of the University of Pennsylvania, is considered the most comprehensive ranking of think tanks globally.

To realize its vision, the GRC focuses on the following objectives:


- Promote communication and cooperation among GCC citizens to facilitate reforms in the region and secure a better future.

The Gulf Research Foundation Geneva (GRCF)

The Gulf Research Center Foundation (**GRC Foundation** or **GRCF**) was established in 2007 in Geneva, Switzerland, under the Swiss Civil Code relating to foundations, and is administered by a prestigious international council, which plays a key advisory role in guiding the Foundation's activities. It is, by definition, a non-profit institution and an umbrella organization under which research, training, and educational programs about the Gulf region are developed and implemented. The Foundation qualifies to receive funding and participate in programs supported by international organizations, the European Union, the United States, and various independent international foundations. Under the laws of Switzerland and the Canton of Geneva, donors based in Switzerland are eligible to receive tax benefits for supporting the work of the GRC Foundation.

The objectives of the GRC Foundation are:

- Actively promote the creation and preservation of peace, security, stability, and sustainable development in the Gulf region and all over the world.
- Conduct intensive scholarly research on the political, economic, environmental, social, and security issues that define the Gulf strategic environment.
- Facilitate communication and dialogue among the people of the Gulf region and throughout the world on Gulf issues.
- Organize Gulf-related conferences and workshops.
- Promote the establishment of special academic programs in association with leading universities.

The Gulf Research Centre Cambridge (GRCC)



The Gulf Research Centre Cambridge (**GRCC**) was established in August 2009 as a cooperative effort between the Gulf Research Center Foundation in Geneva and the Prince Alwaleed Bin Talal Centre of Islamic Studies at the University of Cambridge.

The primary goal of the **GRCC** is to advance education and research on political, economic, social, environmental, security, and energy issues relating to the Gulf region. A significant part of its work involves organizing the annual Gulf Research Meeting, through which the GRCC identifies subjects of importance to the Gulf region, stimulates research in these subject areas, and provides a forum for broad dissemination of the research results, with the goal of helping generate solutions to many of the challenges facing the Gulf region.

The Gulf Research Meeting provides an academic platform to foster Gulf studies and promote exchange among scholars focusing on the Gulf region. Young scholars, in particular, are encouraged to engage in the debate and take part in research collaboration.

The Gulf Research Centre Cambridge is a non-profit, registered charity organization under the Charity Commission for England and Wales and can therefore receive taxdeductible donations.

What We Do - Research & Analysis

Research and Analysis Overview

The Gulf Research Center's mission is to further information and knowledge relating to the Gulf by providing a comprehensive, independent and credible platform for advanced research on GCC politics, economics, defense, security and social issues, and their implications and relevance. The scope of the research programs is defined in coordination with the **GRC** Academic Board and is continuously updated to ensure that the research is in accordance with current issues of concern.

The GRC undertakes research on all elements impacting policymaking in the Gulf, including political systems and development, foreign relations of the Gulf, defense and security issues, the economy, as well as environmental issues, and the role of energy in its regional and worldwide dimensions. In each of its research programs, it is the objective of the GRC and its extensive community of researchers and contributors to shed light on unexplored issues and relationships that are and will be of increased importance both for the Gulf region and the rest of the world.



What We Do - Research & Analysis - cont'd

Gulf Foreign Relations Research Program

A main focus of the Gulf Foreign Relations Research Program of the GRC is the interaction of the Gulf states with the rest of the world-- both regionally in the wider Middle East and globally. Within this research area, GCC foreign relations with a number of countries and regions are analyzed in order to be able to adequately and comprehensively understand the dynamics that are driving the foreign policies of the Gulf states, the issues and developments that are determining the direction of those relations, and how the individual and bilateral ties are impacting the broader regional environment. This research area comprises a number of sub-programs which include Gulf Relations with the European Union, Gulf Relations with Asia, Gulf Relations with Africa, and Gulf-US relations.

Gulf Economics and Energy Research Program

The Gulf Economics and Energy research program focuses on the economies of the GCC member countries and the three neighboring countries, Iraq, Iran, and Yemen. Special attention is given to the still paramount oil and gas sector and the extension of its value chain into petrochemicals, refining, and energy-intensive industries such as aluminum. Other diversification attempts in trade, services, and tourism are also analyzed, with a special emphasis on renewable and nuclear energy. Other areas of interest are regulatory and business environments, capital markets, and trade relations (e.g., WTO, FTAs).

Labor Markets & Migration

The GLMM programme, established in March 2013, is an international independent, nonpartisan, non-profit joint programme of the Gulf Research Center and the Migration Policy Centre (MPC) located in Florence, Italy. The GLMM programme provides data, analyses, and recommendations contributing to the improvement of understanding and management of Gulf labor markets and migration, engaging with and respecting the viewpoints of all stakeholders. The GLMM has released a number of analytical papers and books on Gulf migration and labor market issues. In addition, the program has its own website which features an ever-expanding set of data and documents relating to the GCC's labor markets: <u>https://gulfmigration.grc.net/.</u>

Being a joint programme between a university and a think tank, GLMM activities are geared towards both researchers and students in addition to policymakers, civil society, and media.

What We Do - Research & Analysis - cont'd

Environmental Security & Sustainability

The GRC Environmental Security & Sustainability research program looks at environmental issues in the Gulf region, and seeks to document relevant information about specific concerns related to the Gulf, in order to deepen the awareness and understanding of the following key environmental issues:

- Trends in the state of the environment and natural resources in the Gulf and their natural, social, and economic drivers
- Major environment and sustainability initiatives
- Environmental threats such as water insecurity and desertification, as well as climate change and construction and demolition debris

Politics & Society

The Gulf Politics and Society research program focuses on the following topics:

- Political systems: constitutions, legislatures, judiciaries, executive systems, political and social movements, and civil society and human rights
- Social issues: education, gender studies, youth, media, history, civil society, academia and research, environmental issues from a social perspective
- Culture and demographics

Security & Defense

The Gulf Security and Defense research program focuses on the latest security developments in the Gulf states, including the six GCC member states, Iran, Iraq, and Yemen, in addition to the neighboring region of South Asia, especially Pakistan and Afghanistan. It deals with hard and soft security issues with a special focus on counter-terrorism, nuclear development, weapons of mass destruction in the Gulf, regime stability, maritime security, narcotics, and human trafficking.

What We Do - Training - Executive Learning

A central aim of the activities of the Gulf Research Center is the conduct of a variety of executive learning programs. These programs are designed to provide leadership development opportunities in all aspects of public policy. It is the view of **GRC** that programs in governmental processes and critical policy issues are vital to understanding today's environment and preparing emerging and established leaders to more effectively engage with individuals and institutions throughout the rest of the world.



GRC programs are directly tied to the Center's commitment to research and its involvement with public policy. Participants have the opportunity to learn from and exchange ideas with leading scholars and senior public policy officials in their respective fields. In that context, **GRC** Executive Learning Programs create a learning environment that is unparalleled in both its scope and value as far as Gulf issues are concerned.


What We Do - Publications
